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Crockett County has a unique history to share. Carved from Texas Territory in 1875 it was named in honor of Colonel David Crockett who died in fighting in the defense of the liberties of Texas and the Alamo in 1836. He never trod the soil nor beheld its beauty, but he is forever linked to the county that proudly bears his name.

The county was founded in 1891 under the shade of a young oak tree, now a historic marker. Crockett County is the eighth largest of 254 counties in Texas and covers over 3,000 square miles of ruggedly beautiful West Texas. The one and only town within its boundaries is Ozona, whose motto is, "The Biggest Little Town in the World". The town is unincorporated using only county government to maintain its fine quality of life enjoyed by 3,500 persons.

Many visitors stop in Ozona as an interesting diversion from a long trip down I-10 West. They enjoy the quiet peaceful setting under the tall pecan trees at the Town Square. There they can view the David Crockett and The Tie That Binds Monuments, a memorial to the pioneer families that came to settle this land, and to those who followed. You can truly "Hang Your Hat in History" and enjoy the historical markers located throughout Ozona that bring to life the beginnings and struggles of the small but charming West Texas town.

A local treasure, the Crockett County Museum is a must see for visitors. The three story museum hosts tools of the working cowboy, an award-winning Indian Exhibit, a pioneer room and general store.

Ozona truly is "Out in the West, Where the Air is Pure, the Climate Agreeable and the People Friendly The Best Place on Earth to Call Home."

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
