Ozona Chamber of Commerce and the ASU Small Business Development Center Hosted a Lunch & Learn on June 14th.

On June 14th, the Chamber's Conference Room became a classroom for several local residents who are thinking about starting their own small business. The informational course titled "Lunch & Learn: Basics of Starting a New Business" was taught by Alejandro Castañon, a certified business advisor with the Angelo State University Small Business Development Center. The course covered the three main areas of business management: technical, marketing and management.

Castañon explained that a person needs to decide what type of business they will start: sole proprietorships, partnership or corporation. He said the ASU-SBDC can help people with this step, as well as help with obtaining an Employer Identification Number through the IRS website. Castañon also discussed how to get a license for state sales tax through the Texas Comptroller's Office. He described the importance of having a good bookkeeping system, such as QuickBooks, that tracks income, expenses, and payroll. He stressed that it is extremely important to develop a business plan early in the process of starting your business. ASU-SBDC has a free online course to help with the business plan, as well as many other business seminars throughout the year.





Did You Know?

97% of the Earth's water is salt water. Only 3% is fresh. Two-thirds of the fresh water is frozen in the Arctics and glaciers. As one of our most precious resources, we must do everything possible to conserve it, especially during times of drought. We encourage you to join us in this important endeavor by checking out these tips!

Water Wise Tips:

- -Water during the cooler parts of the day. Do not water between 10am & 6pm.
 -Save 15 gallons each watering time by adjusting sprinklers to avoid water on sidewalks and streets.
 - -Save 40 gallons per day by using gray water for irrigation & plants.
 - -Use native plants in your garden that are by nature drought-tolerant.
- -Leave lawn clippings on your grass. This cools the ground and holds in moisture.
 -Repair pool leaks. A one-inch leak in a 15-by-30 foot pool can waste 102,000 gallons a year.
 - -Fix leaky faucets and plumbing joints.
 - -Turn off the water while brushing your teeth and while shaving to save about 10 gallons a day.
 - -Take shorter showers. A standard showerhead uses 2.5 gallons per minute.
