

Did you know the date and location of the first Thanksgiving celebrated on what is now the United States territory is debatable? Many believe it was first observed by the Berkeley Hundred charter in Virginia in 1619.

But the most famous first Thanksgiving was held at the Plymouth Colony in 1621 for three days shortly after the first



harvest. These settlers, known as Pilgrims, were the survivors of a harsh winter in which half of the original group died due to disease and starvation. The settlers had been helped by the last remaining member of the Patuxet tribe, Tisquantum (also known as Squanto). Squanto had originally learned English as a slave in Europe. He taught the Pilgrims how to catch eel, grow corn and served as an interpreter to the other area tribes. Without his help, it is possible that none of the Pilgrims would have survived. The actual date of the first Thanksgiving isn't known, but many believe it was sometime between the end of September and early November. In attendance were the remaining 53 Pilgrims and 90 Wampanoag Native American people. The feast was cooked by four women: Eleanor Billington, Elizabeth Hopkins, Mary Brewster, and Susanna White, along with young daughters and both male and female servants.

The Pilgrims held another official Thanksgiving in the summer of 1623. This ceremony was likely the first civil recognition of Thanksgiving in New England, because the order for it had been given by the colony's Governor Bradford instead of the church.
