TDid You Know?

The first day of Fall (Sept. 22nd) is also known as the Autumn Equinox. So what is an equinox, you ask? There are two days in the year when the day

and night are exactly the same length. The sun shines directly on the equator and both the northern and southern hemispheres receive the same amount of sunlight. The word "equinox" is derived from two Latin words: equal (*aequus*) and night (*nox*). After the Autumn Equinox, the northern hemisphere will tilt away from the sun, causing the nights to be longer and the temperatures to fall. The days will get shorter and shorter until the Winter Soltice, which also is the first day of Winter.
